STREETLIGHTS

Outages for street lights that are owned and maintained by Alliant Energy can be reported at AlliantEnergy.com.

You will receive a confirmation and follow up email after your information is received and the request completed. This option is quicker than calling. Lights owned by property owners are their responsibility to maintain.



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SMALL WATER USE REPORTED AS LEAKS

The water metering system is flagging many households for water leaks. When I reviewed the report, it appears that the average water use is between 1 and 5 gallons of water per hour in a 24-hour period. This use does not seem critical but over a long period of time the gallons will add up to additional water use. Please look your furnace over, especially if you have a humidifier attached to it. Humidifier units on furnaces need to be cleaned and maintained regularly in order to continue working properly. A little service work now may save you the cost of extra gallons of water on your utility bill.

TIME IS RUNNING OUT!

All dogs, age 5 months or older, who reside in the Village of Dane must be licensed. Proof of rabies vaccination is needed in order for a license to be issued. **Late fees of \$20** will be applied after March 31, 2017. Please complete the forms and get your dog tags as soon as possible.



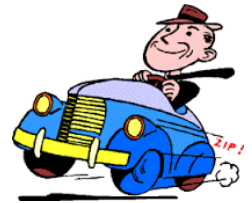
DELINQUENT WATER BILLS

Water and Sewer bills are sent out monthly and the amount due is to be paid monthly. Late fees of 1% are applied to all outstanding balances the day after the due date. The clerk will be sending notices on delinquent accounts in March. Account holders will have 10 days to pay the balance in full or agree to a payment plan. Otherwise your water is at risk of being disconnected. If your water service is disconnected, service will not be restored until the account is paid in full along with a \$50 reconnection fee. All utility customers are encouraged to get past due balances paid current as soon as possible.



HAVE YOU NOTICED THE NEW SPEED SIGN?

The Police Department has installed one of the two new lighted speed signs that reflect the current speed of vehicles coming into the village on Main Street. The new signs should help slow traffic down and remind drivers that they are entering a lower speed zone.



WINTER PARKING STILL IN EFFECT

Just a reminder that winter parking is still in effect until March 15; whether snow and ice are predicted to fall or not, please do not park on village streets from 2 am until 6 am.

The polls will open at 7 am and close at 8 pm. Voter ID is required and you must be registered at your current address to vote. Absentee voting will begin on Monday, March 13, 2017 in the Clerk's office. This election has local races for two Village Trustees and a race for Lodi School Board.
